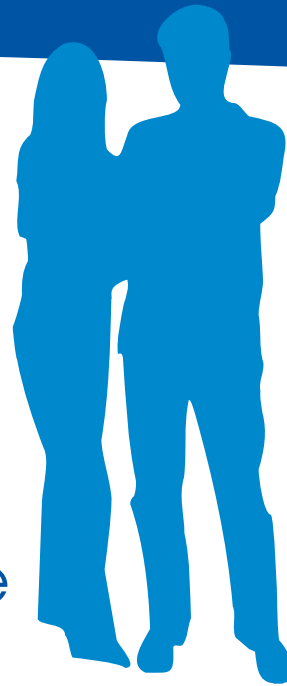

# we'll provide the training

Leaders come from all walks of life, from parents of Scouts, to childhood Scouts, to people who have no Scouting experience whatsoever there is no prior experience necessary to become a Leader - Training is provided in all aspects of youth leadership, program planning, safety and other requirements.

Leadership Training is provided through the Scouts Australia Institute of Training (SAIT). Leaders can also further enhance their own skills and qualifications - the SAIT is a registered training organisation that is accredited to award nationally recognised qualifications, such as a Certificate III, IV or Diploma in Leadership.

# your commitment

Leaders must be motivated individuals, dedicated to providing exciting and dynamic training programs for their youth in the section of their Scout Group.

Leaders are required to commit to attending:

- Section meetings one night a week during the school term.
- A monthly Leaders meeting of their Group and District colleagues.
- Group activities, such as hiking or camping trips, a few weekends each term.

Kids safety is very important to Scouts. Therefore, along with training in child safety, Leaders must undergo a standard Government Police and Working with Children check to ensure the security of young people.
